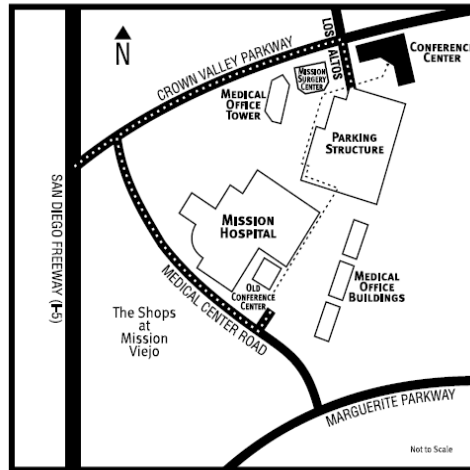

## **DESCRIPTION**

Care of the critically ill patient during emergencies or following traumatic injury holds special challenges for those who deliver healthcare. This seminar is designed to educate healthcare and prehospital professionals in the current trends of state-of-the-art emergency care management.
