The basic course emphasizes an all-hazards approach to mass casualty incident management and facilitates ongoing qualitative and quantitative assessment of an incident. The recognition and management of the disaster scene and victims is reinforced through the DISASTER Paradigm and the concept of MASS Triage is introduced. In addition, the BDLS course adds critical information on the role of the health care professional in the public health and incident management systems, community mental health, and special needs of vulnerable populations. This is a pre-requisite for ADLS.

- Define "Disaster" and "Mass Casualty Incident"
- Identify components of DISASTER Paradigm™
- Identify and apply the BDLS® triage model using "MASS" & "ID me"

# Advanced Disaster Life Support

The advanced course is a practicum course for those who have successfully completed the BDLS course. It prepares participants for mass casualty decontamination, use of personal protective equipment, essential disaster skills, mass casualty incident communications and technological applications. The course uses simulated scenarios, interactive sessions and drills with high-fidelity mannequins and volunteer patients to provide a true-to-life, practical experience in treatment and response. The course is presented over two days—Day 1 is primarily instructional and Day 2 incorporates hands-on training distributed over four advanced training stations.

## Objectives:

- Apply the BDLS® DISASTER Paradigm™ to respond to various disaster scenarios
- Apply the BDLS® triage model utilizing "M.A.S.S." and "ID-me"
- Demonstrate decontamination techniques for disasters with contaminated casualties
- Demonstrate Personal Protective Equipment use in nuclear, biological & chemical scenarios
- Practice the use of: auto-injectors for chemical casualties, small pox bifurcated needles

# Decon Disaster Life Support

(Meets the CFR 1910.120 requirement for Hazardous Materials Awareness)



The decontamination of victims following a chemical, biological, radiological (CBRNE) event requires specific training. In a mass casualty event necessitating the decontamination of a large number of patients, those skills may become the responsibility of non-medical staff to facilitate the immediate triage and treatment of ill or injured patients by healthcare professional.

NDLS-DECON™ is designed to meet this need by providing introductory training for hospital based decontamination to all levels of expertise. NDLS-DECON™ provides flexibility permitting training to be customized to specific equipment and site features. The components of the NDLS-DECON™ program include:

**Lectures covering:** Regulations, operations and equipment

**Demonstration and practice:** Donning/Doffing PPE; Site selection and set-up; Small Group Interactive Sessions; Patient Decontamination drill
